

Methodology

- Survey conducted across 8 European countries from October 30 to December 20, 2017
- 16,114 total respondents
- Based on telephone interviews with nationally representative samples of adults 18 and older
- The margin of sampling error for the completed set of weighted data is $\pm 2.6\% \pm 2.9\%$








Distribution of Groups by Country

Adults who are populist and mainstream on the left, center and right



















Ideological Divides on Government Providing Standard of Living








European Publics Split on Trustworthiness of Banks


Those With Populist Views Trust Banks Less


Distrust of News Media Common in Many Nations





































Relatively Low Ratings for Populist Parties






Right Populist Parties Get Highest Ratings from Right Populists



Left Populists Most Favorable of Left Populist Parties





Populist Groups View Italy's Five Star More Positively


Adults with favorable views of Five Star Movement
