

## **2007 National Survey of Latinos: As Illegal Immigration Issue Heats Up, Hispanics Feel a Chill**

*Revisions made to final report on December 19, 2007*

A Note on Terminology: Statement added to indicate “citizens” include citizens by birth and naturalization.

Table of Contents: Sub-headings removed from the Executive Summary and Overview section. Revisions made to text of two sub-headings in Views About Immigrants section.

Executive Summary and Overview section: Following footnote inserted on page 2 –

Estimates for non-Hispanics are based on telephone interviews conducted October 25-28, 2007, among a nationwide sample of 1,009 adults, 18 years of age or older, conducted under the direction of Opinion Research Corporation (ORC). For results based on the total sample, one can say with 95% confidence that the error attributable to sampling is plus/minus 3.5 percentage points.

Page 5: First full paragraph, “...have experienced” changed to “...had experienced”.

Page 7: Second bullet point, first sentence revised to read “...down from nine in the summer of 2006.”

Page 24: First full paragraph, first sentence, “three-quarters” changed to “eight-in-ten”.

Page 25: First paragraph, second sentence changed to read “...has been a positive development than those who say there are too many immigrants...”

Page 25: Period added at end of last sentence on page.

Page 25: Sub-headings within Figure 21 changed from “...by views on current amount of immigrants” to “...by views on impact on Hispanics”.

Page 37: Appendix A, first paragraph, “Native born” changed “native-born” and “Foreign born” changed to “foreign-born”.

Page 48: Wording of Question 42 moved to page 49.

Other: On different pages, “stepped up” changed to “stepped-up”.
