However, for analytical purposes, only those who said they have one job or have multiple jobs but consider one to be their primary job are included in this topline. Those who have multiple jobs and *do not* consider one to be their primary job or did not provide an answer to the question about how many jobs they have are excluded from this analysis.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> In the 2020 survey, this question was asked of those who said they were "employed full-time" or "employed part-time" when asked, "Which of the following best describes your current employment situation?" By contrast, in the 2023 survey, this question was asked of those who said they "work full time for pay" or "work part time for pay" when asked, "What is your current work situation?" The only difference between the two is the slight wording change in how employed adults were defined. JOBTYPEMOD was the same in both surveys.
