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Trump Gets Negative Reviews Internationally as Fewer Say U.S. Is a Reliable Partner

36-country survey finds declining ratings for the U.S. amid rising concerns about its foreign policy and the health of its democracy

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About this research

This Pew Research Center report looks at views of the U.S., U.S. President Donald Trump, and opinion of the role the U.S. is playing in the world.

Why did we do this?

Pew Research Center does research to help the public, media and decision-makers understand important topics. We have [studied global views](#) of the United States for more than two decades. We did this study to understand how people in other countries view the U.S. and Trump, now in the second year of his second administration.

How did we do this?

We surveyed 42,151 people across 36 countries: Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, France, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, the Netherlands, Nigeria, Pakistan, Peru, the Philippines, Poland, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Thailand, Turkey, the U.K., and the West Bank and East Jerusalem.

Interviews were conducted from February 8 to May 13, 2026. We designed the surveys so we could talk about the views of the adult population in each country. Here are the [survey questions](#) used for this report, along with responses, and the [survey methodology](#).

Trump Gets Negative Reviews Internationally as Fewer Say U.S. Is a Reliable Partner

36-country survey finds declining ratings for the U.S. amid rising concerns about its foreign policy and the health of its democracy

A new Pew Research Center survey finds negative – and often overwhelmingly negative – views of U.S. President Donald Trump in regions around the globe.

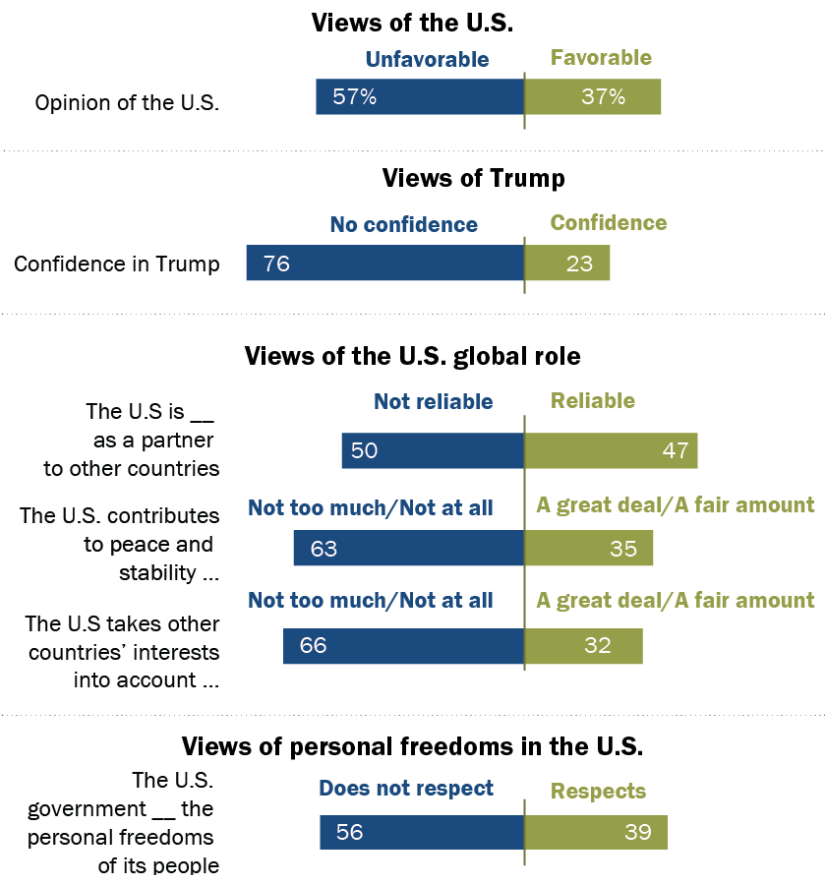
Across 36 nations polled, a median of 23% of adults express confidence in his leadership of world affairs. In many countries, confidence in Trump has slipped since last year.

Overall ratings for the United States are also largely negative. Favorable views of the country have declined in many places over the past year, including double-digit drops in Indonesia, Italy, Nigeria, South Africa, South Korea and Turkey.

There are seven nations in the study where a majority of adults rate the U.S. positively. The highest rating (81% favorable) comes from Israel. Some of the lowest ratings are from predominantly Muslim publics, such as Malaysians, Pakistanis, Turks, and

Palestinians in the West Bank and East Jerusalem. (We were unable to survey in Gaza.)

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Trump gets mostly poor marks for his handling of key foreign policy issues, including tariffs, Gaza, Iran, Greenland and the Russia-Ukraine war.

The survey reveals striking changes over time in how people perceive the U.S. and its role in world affairs.

The share of the public who considers the U.S. a reliable partner has declined steeply in many countries since we last asked this question in 2022, during Joe Biden's presidency.

This downward turn in opinion has taken place in several nations with which the U.S. has longstanding economic and security ties. For example, in Canada, 83% described the U.S. as a reliable partner in 2022, compared with 35% today. Large declines have also been measured in some of America's key Asia-Pacific partners.

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A 36-country median of 35% say the U.S. contributes to peace and stability around the world. The share of people who hold this view is down significantly in many countries since 2023.

What is a median?

In this analysis, median scores are used to help readers see overall patterns in the data. The median percentage is the middle number in a list of all percentages sorted from highest to lowest.

Similarly, the share who think the U.S. takes into account the interests of other countries when making foreign policy decisions has declined in most nations where trends from 2023 are available.

For instance, 60% of Germans three years ago said the U.S. considers other countries' interests, but that share has dropped to 23% today. German public opinion is now similar to or more negative than what was measured during George W. Bush's presidency, when many people in Europe and elsewhere [strongly opposed the war in Iraq](#) and other major elements of U.S. foreign policy. In surveys conducted from 2002 to 2007, between 27% and 53% of Germans said the U.S. considers the interests of countries like theirs when making foreign policy.

Our polling over the past few years has found [widespread concerns](#) about the health of American democracy in many places, and the new survey shows that large shares of people around the world no longer believe the U.S. respects individual liberty.

A 36-country median of 39% say the U.S. government respects the personal freedoms of its people, while 56% say it does not.

In 12 of the 13 countries where we last asked about this in 2021, during the Biden administration, there have been double-digit declines in the shares who say the U.S. respects personal freedoms.

Over a longer span, some of these shares have fallen even farther in several of these nations.

A 2013 Center survey represented a high point for this measure in several nations we have polled regularly. That year, as Barack Obama began his second term as president, three-quarters or more in Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Israel, Italy, Japan, Poland, the Philippines, South Korea and the United Kingdom said the U.S. respected personal freedoms.

However, in 2014, this view became less common in some countries [after disclosures](#) by former National Security Agency contractor Edward Snowden revealed the government's vast capacity to intercept communications around the world.

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This year, the share of the public saying the U.S. respects personal freedoms is the lowest it's been in several countries we have surveyed for years, including Australia, Brazil, Chile, Greece, Indonesia, Italy, Kenya, Mexico, the Netherlands, Peru, the Philippines, Poland, South Africa, South Korea and Sweden.

For this report, we surveyed 42,151 people in 36 countries from Feb. 8 to May 13, 2026.

Where does Trump get his highest and lowest ratings?

Trump gets his best ratings in the Philippines, Israel, Nigeria, Kenya and Ghana.

In Israel, views of Trump are considerably more positive among Jews (79% have confidence in him) than among Arabs (13%).

And in Nigeria, Trump receives more positive ratings among Christians (87%) than Muslims (33%). Since last year, confidence in him has risen by 6 percentage points among Christians but dropped by 41 points among Muslims.

There are 26 places surveyed in which 30% or less expresses confidence in the U.S. president. In Turkey, as well as in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, that share is in the single digits.

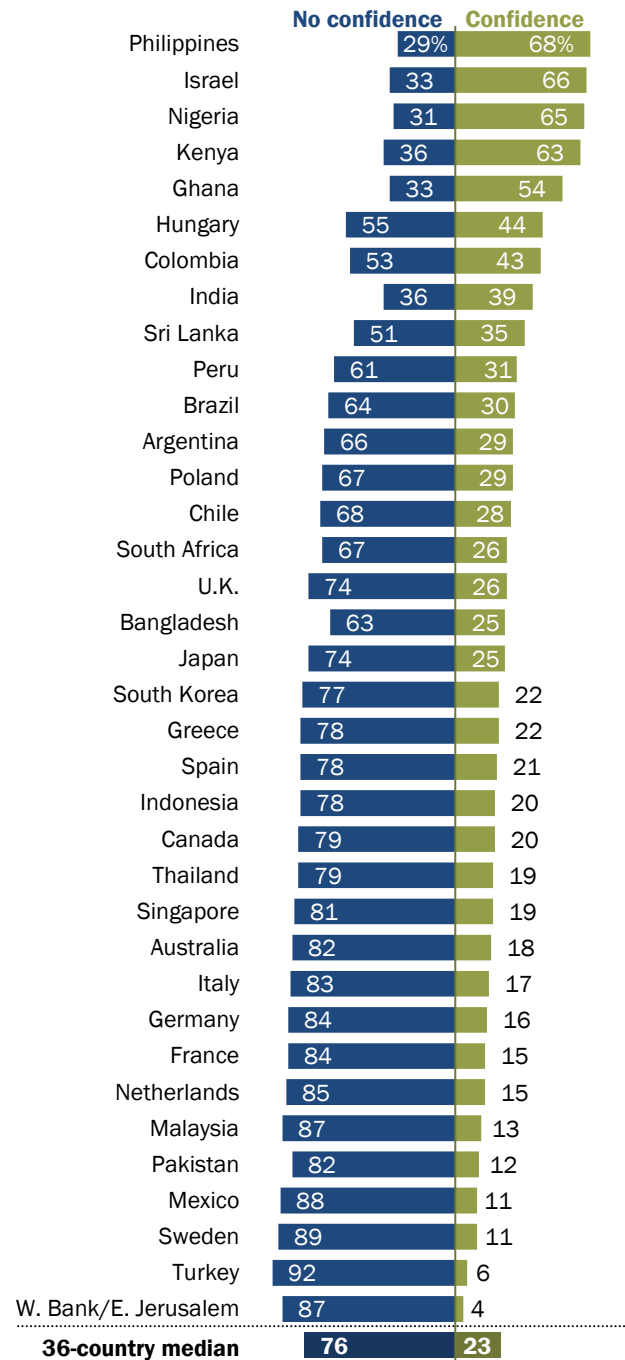
Confidence in Trump has declined since last year in 16 of 24 nations where trend data is available. There is no country surveyed in which attitudes toward him have become more positive.

In 18 of 27 countries where we measure political ideology, people on the right are more likely than those on the left to express confidence in Trump. He receives particularly positive marks from Europeans with favorable views of right-wing populist parties. Still, even among supporters of some of these parties, Trump's ratings have worsened since last year.

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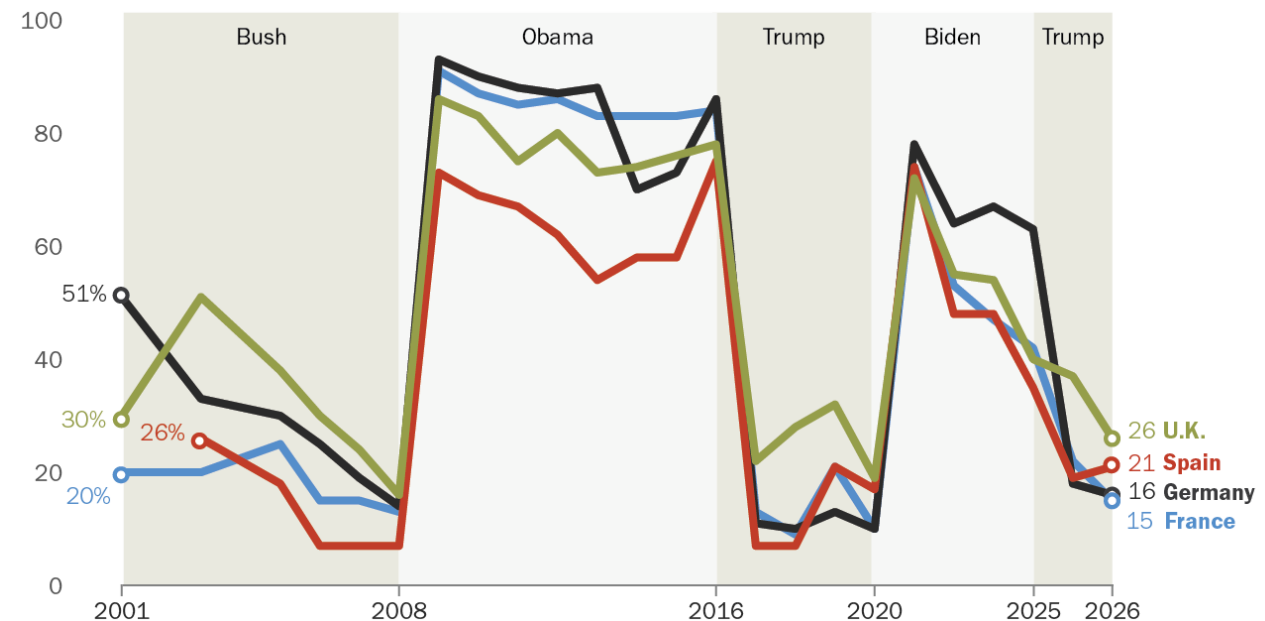
How do ratings of Trump compare with previous presidents?

Pew Research Center has measured international attitudes toward U.S. presidents for over two decades, charting large shifts in public opinion in many regions. Findings from France, Germany, Spain and the U.K. highlight some long-term trends in views of recent presidents.

The latest ratings for Trump in these four nations, while low, tend to be slightly higher than at the [end of his first term](#). They're about equal to or somewhat higher than ratings for Bush at the end of his second term.

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Obama consistently received much higher ratings in these Western European countries during his two terms in the White House. Views of Biden were also relatively positive, although attitudes toward Biden turned more negative over the course of his presidency.

Do people approve of how Trump is handling major international issues?

We asked respondents whether they approve or disapprove of how Trump is dealing with eight key global issues. At least half of adults in most countries disapprove of how he is handling each of these.

In every nation surveyed, most or all interviews took place after the U.S. and Israel launched the military conflict with Iran on Feb. 28, 2026.

Overall, a median of 74% of adults across 36 nations disapprove of how Trump is dealing with **Iran**. Israel is the only country where a clear majority (73%) approve, though 51% also express this view in Kenya and Nigeria.

Relatively few approve in Pakistan (21%) and Turkey (5%), which share a border with Iran.

Similarly, just 5% of Palestinians in the West Bank and East Jerusalem approve.

To explore how the war may have affected overall views of the U.S., we conducted a separate analysis using a statistical technique called regression. The results suggest that as the war – and our survey fieldwork – progressed, attitudes toward the U.S. became more negative in some countries.

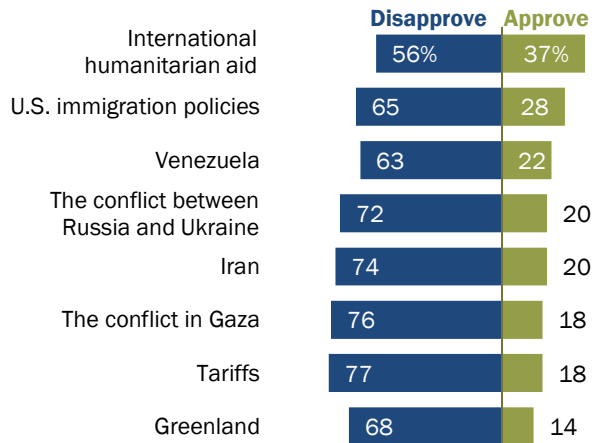

Trump gets his highest ratings on **international humanitarian aid**, though most disapprove of how he’s handling this issue. (We did not ask about knowledge of the Trump administration’s cuts to foreign aid or knowledge of its other policies.) Majorities approve of how he has dealt with humanitarian aid in five of the middle-income nations (as defined by [World Bank lending groups](#)) surveyed: the Philippines (66%), Kenya (65%), Sri Lanka (57%), Colombia (56%) and Peru (55%).

Trump gets his second-highest ratings on **immigration**. His immigration policies tend to be more popular among people on the ideological right, and especially Europeans who support right-wing populist parties.

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A median of just 22% approve of the way Trump has dealt with **Venezuela**. Still, views are slightly more positive in some Latin American nations, including Venezuela's neighbor Colombia (46%).

Trump receives low marks in Europe for his handling of both **Greenland** and the **Russia-Ukraine war**. For more, read: "[*European views of Trump and the U.S. are especially negative.*](#)"

There is no country in which a majority approves of how Trump is dealing with the conflict in **Gaza**. (At the time of our survey, a [*fragile ceasefire*](#) existed between Israel and Hamas.) Very few Palestinians in the West Bank and East Jerusalem approve (3%), while Israelis are divided: 48% approve and 48% disapprove, with Israeli Jews (57% approve) and Israeli Arabs (14%) expressing very different views.

The Trump administration's **tariff policies** are widely unpopular. Kenya is the only country surveyed in which a majority (55%) approve of how Trump is handling this issue. Attitudes are especially negative in many nations with which the U.S. has major trade relationships, including the U.K. (27% approve), India (18%), Canada (17%), Japan (15%), South Korea (14%), Mexico (11%) and Germany (8%).

Do people around the world view the U.S. favorably or unfavorably?

Across the 36 countries surveyed, a median of 37% of adults express a favorable view of the U.S., while 57% have an unfavorable view.

In Europe and the Asia-Pacific region, opinions are largely negative: Seven-in-ten or more in many of these nations rate the U.S. unfavorably.

The U.S. receives its highest rating in Israel, at 81% favorable, while roughly eight-in-ten in Turkey and in the West Bank and East Jerusalem see the U.S. negatively.

In [past surveys](#), the U.S. has received largely favorable ratings in the African nations surveyed. This year, views are relatively more positive than not in Ghana, Kenya and Nigeria. Still, favorable ratings are down 15 points since last year in Nigeria, as well as in South Africa.

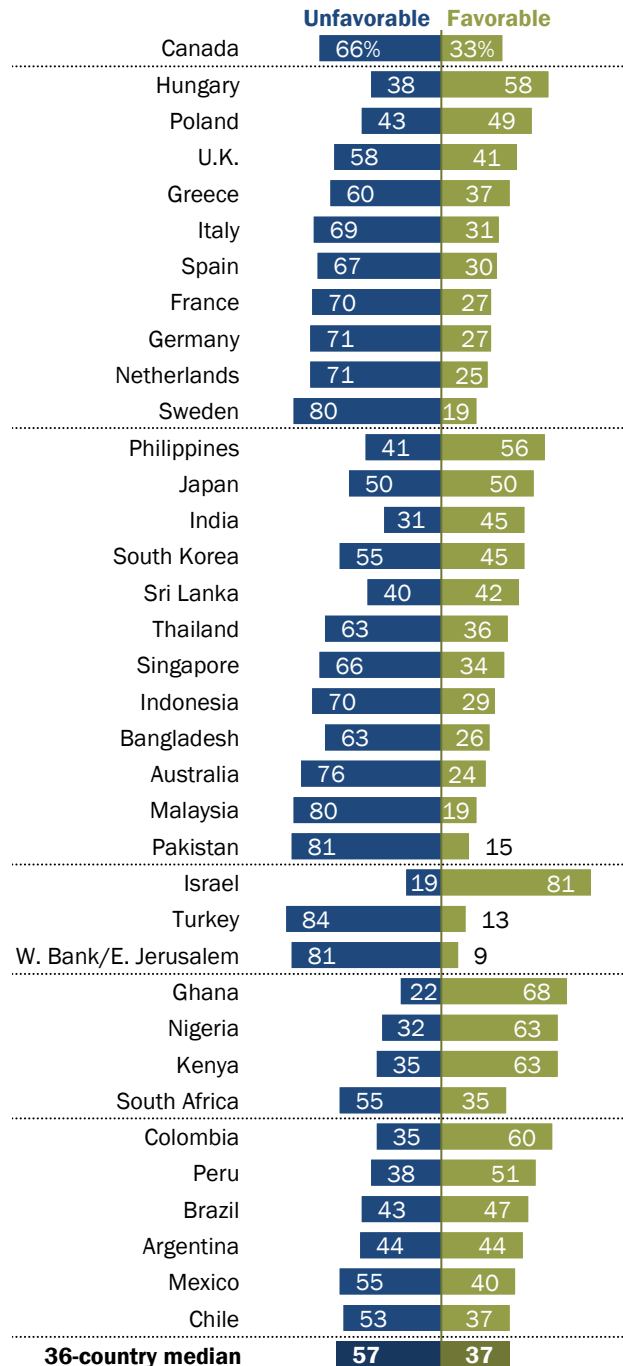
Latin Americans express a range of opinions. Most Colombians rate the U.S. positively, while views are more divided in Peru, Brazil and Argentina. Around half or more Mexicans and Chileans have an unfavorable opinion.

Favorable views have declined significantly in 15 of 24 nations where trends from last year are available. Mexico is the only country where views improved, from 29% to 40% favorable.

In many of the countries we have surveyed since 2002 – including Canada, France, Germany, Italy, the Philippines, South Africa, South Korea and the U.K. – positive ratings are at or near the lowest they've been.

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And although overall ratings for the U.S. are positive in Israel and Nigeria, they are at historic lows in our polling among some subgroups in both countries. Only 19% of Arab Israelis express a favorable view of the U.S., down from 29% last year and the lowest share we've measured in any of our Israel surveys. In contrast, 96% of Jewish Israelis have a favorable opinion of the U.S.

Similarly, a record-low 36% of Nigerian Muslims rate the U.S. favorably, down drastically from 73% last year. Roughly eight-in-ten Nigerian Christians (82%) express a favorable view.

Does the U.S. contribute to peace and stability?

A median of 35% of adults across the 36 nations polled think the U.S. contributes a great deal or a fair amount to peace and stability around the world.

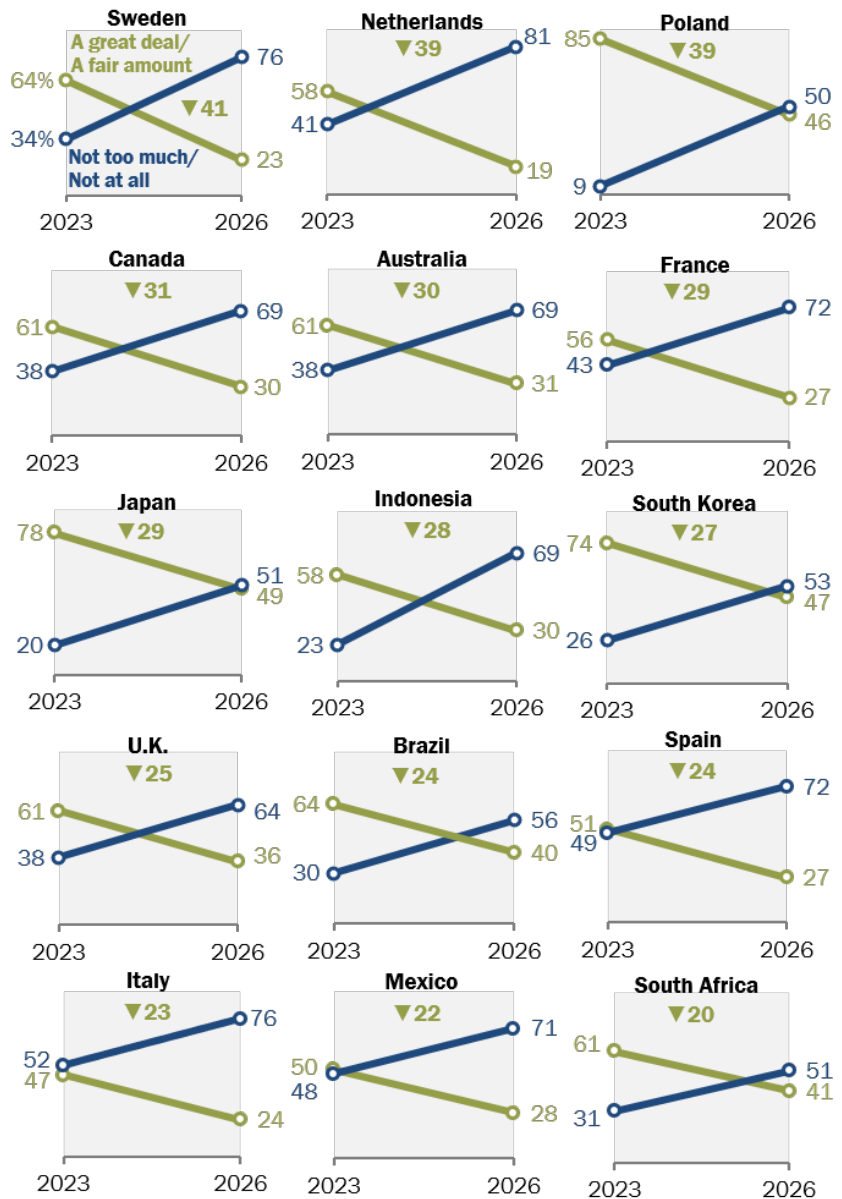
However, opinions vary widely. Around seven-in-ten or more in the Philippines (77%), Kenya (74%) and Israel (73%) say the U.S. contributes to global stability, while one-in-five or fewer share this view in Argentina (20%), the Netherlands (19%), the West Bank and East Jerusalem (14%) and Turkey (10%).

People have become much less likely to believe the U.S. adds to global peace and security since we last asked this question in 2023, during the Biden administration. This share of the public has shrunk in 19 of 22 countries where trend data is available. In Sweden, the Netherlands, Poland, Canada and Australia, it's fallen by 30 points or more.

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Does the U.S. consider other countries' interests?

Across the 36 nations polled, a median of 32% of adults think the U.S. takes into account the interests of countries like theirs a great deal or a fair amount in its foreign policy decisions.

Majorities hold this view in the Philippines (74%), Kenya (68%), Israel (68%), Nigeria (64%) and Sri Lanka (62%).

Few in the NATO member states surveyed say the U.S. considers their interests. Hungarians (35%) are the most likely of these allies to say it takes other nations' interests into account, followed by the U.K. (26%). Only 10% in France and 8% in Sweden express this opinion.

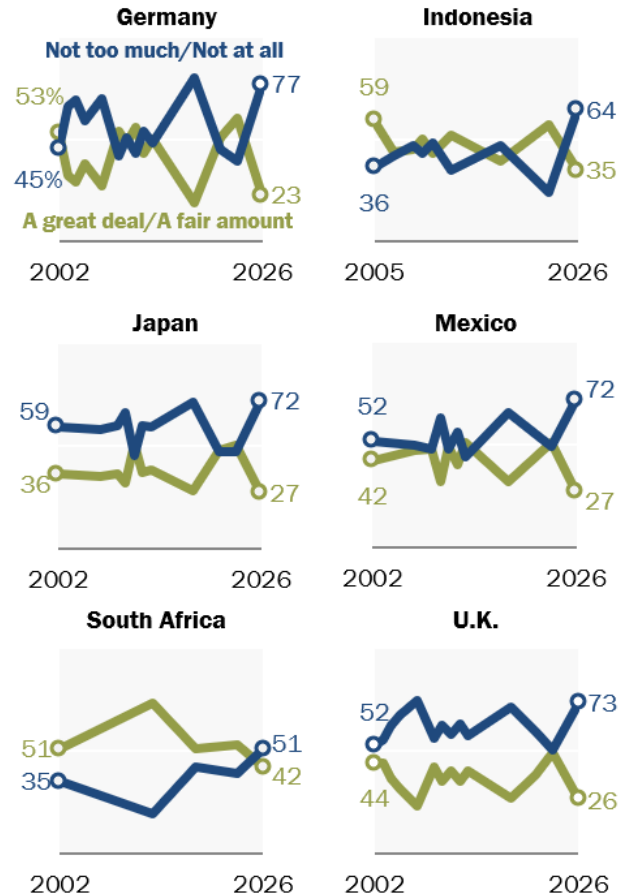

This view has become less common in 19 of 22 countries where trend data from 2023 is available.

In many nations where we have been asking this question over many years, the share of the public who think the U.S. considers other countries' interests is at or near an all-time low, while the share who say it does not is at or near an all-time high. This is the case in Germany, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, South Africa and the U.K.

How do views of Trump compare with other global leaders?

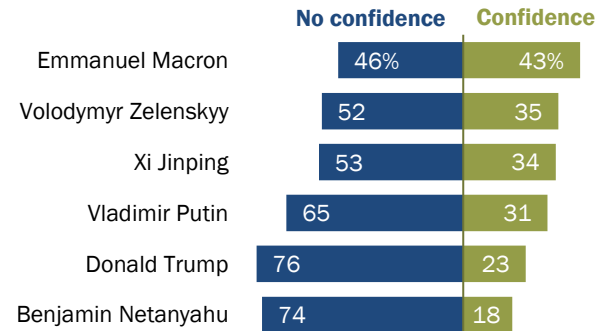
Across 36 countries, a median of 23% of adults have confidence in U.S. President Donald Trump to do the right thing regarding world affairs.

Confidence in Trump is lower than confidence in French President Emmanuel Macron, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin. Of the leaders asked about, only Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu receives lower marks.

These findings come from a new Pew Research Center survey of 42,151 adults in 36 countries, conducted Feb. 8-May 13, 2026. They are [part of a larger report](#) on global views of the United States and its president.

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Where do people have more positive views of Trump than other leaders?

Colombia, Hungary, Israel and the Philippines stand out as four countries where views of Trump are more positive than views of other leaders we asked about.

- In Colombia, 43% have confidence in Trump – higher than the 37% who have confidence in Macron and the roughly third or fewer who have confidence in the other leaders.
- In Hungary, 44% have confidence in Trump, compared with around a third or fewer who say the same of Macron, Xi or Putin. Confidence in Netanyahu and Zelenskyy is even lower.
- In Israel, 66% have confidence in Trump, while only a third or fewer have confidence in the other leaders. (We did not ask about confidence in Netanyahu.)
- In the Philippines, 68% have confidence in Trump, while 61% have confidence in Macron and around half or more have confidence in the other leaders.

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In some other countries, including several middle-income nations (as defined by [World Bank lending groups](#)) like Argentina, Brazil, Ghana, Nigeria and Peru, Trump is among the leaders rated most positively. In most of these countries, confidence in Trump is similar to confidence in either Xi or Macron.

Where do people have more negative views of Trump than other leaders?

Trump is either the leader with the lowest confidence rating or tied for lowest in many countries. This is the case, for example, in the United States' neighbors to both the south and north:

- In Mexico, 11% have confidence in Trump, compared with 18% who have confidence in Netanyahu. Around three-in-ten have confidence in Putin and Xi.
- Canadians have similarly low levels of confidence in Putin (18%), Trump (20%) and Netanyahu (23%) and relatively more confidence in Xi (35%), Macron (59%) and Zelenskyy (65%).

In three European countries – France, Germany and Greece – confidence ratings for Trump are among the lowest of the leaders asked about, often tied with Putin, Netanyahu or both. For instance, 16% of Germans have confidence in Trump and similar shares say the same about Putin (15%) and Netanyahu (15%), a sharp contrast to the 72% of Germans who have confidence in Macron.

Trump tends to receive particularly low marks relative to other leaders in the Muslim-majority publics surveyed. Among Palestinians in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, for example, only 4% have confidence in Trump – similar to the 2% who say the same of Netanyahu, but much lower than the roughly four-in-ten who have confidence in Putin and Xi. In Malaysia, too, Trump ties with Netanyahu for the lowest rating.

Comparing how Americans and others around the world view the United States' global role

People around the world are generally negative in their evaluations of U.S. foreign policy. In most countries, majorities say the United States does not promote peace and stability around the world and does not take other countries' interests into account on matters of international policy. But Americans themselves are divided on these questions.

These findings come from a new Pew Research Center survey of 42,151 adults in 36 countries, conducted Feb. 8-May 13, 2026, and additional interviews with 3,507 U.S. adults conducted March 23-29, 2026. They are [part of a larger report](#) on views of the U.S. and its president.

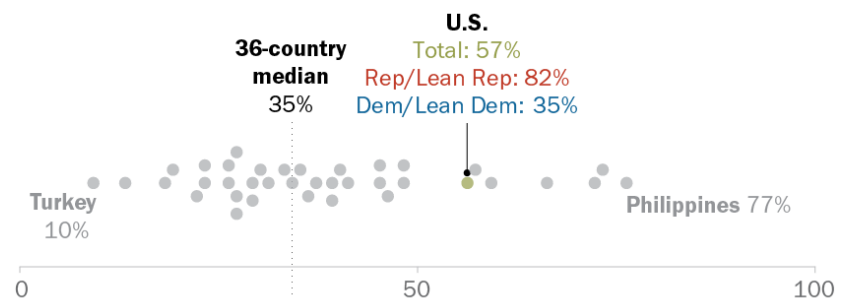
Does the U.S. contribute to peace and stability around the world?

Across the 36 non-U.S. countries surveyed, a median of 35% of adults say the U.S. contributes to global peace and stability, while 63% say it does not. Some of the places with the lowest shares saying the U.S. contributes to stability are in Europe and Latin America. For example, around a quarter of people or fewer in France, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Spain and Sweden think this is the case, as do 20% in Argentina.

But in some nations, majorities say the U.S. *does* contribute to global peace and stability. For example, around seven-in-ten or more hold this view in Israel, Kenya, Nigeria and the Philippines.

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In many countries, fewer now believe the U.S. contributes to stability than when we last asked in 2023. In Sweden, for example, the share saying it contributes in this way dropped from 64% in 2023 to 23% today.

Americans are more likely than people in most other countries to say the U.S. contributes to peace and stability around the world – 57% hold this view. However, Republicans and Republican-leaning independents (82%) are much more likely than Democrats and Democratic leaners (35%) to express this view.

In this analysis, median scores are used to help readers see overall patterns in the data. The median percentage is the middle number in a list of all percentages sorted from highest to lowest.

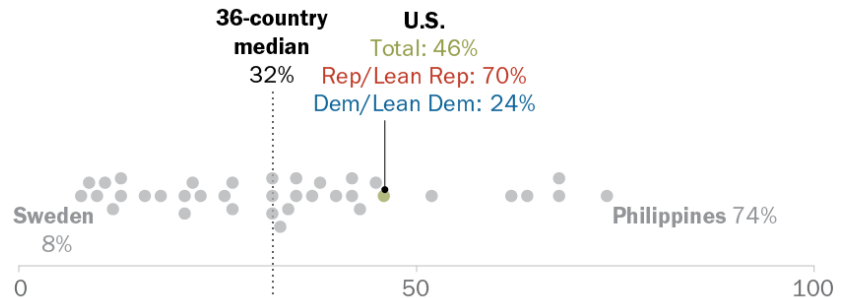
Does the U.S. take the interests of other countries into account?

In most of the 36 non-U.S. countries surveyed, relatively few people think the U.S. considers other nations' interests when making foreign policy. Overall, a median of 32% say the U.S. takes the interests of countries like their own into account.

Once again, Europeans stand out as especially critical of U.S. foreign policy. Around one-in-ten in France, the Netherlands, Sweden and Spain say the U.S. accounts for the interests of countries like theirs. And in many countries, the share saying this has declined since 2023.

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Americans are more likely than people in most other nations surveyed to say the U.S. *does* take other countries' interests into account, but they are again divided by party. Overall, 46% think the U.S. takes other interests into account in its foreign policymaking, while 53% say it does not. But seven-in-ten Republicans say the U.S. *does* take these interests into account, compared with 24% of Democrats.

Does the U.S. government respect the personal freedoms of the American people?

In the 36 non-U.S. countries surveyed, a median of 39% of adults say the U.S. government respects the personal freedoms of its people, while 56% say that it does not.

The shares saying the U.S. *does* respect the personal freedoms of its people tend to be higher in countries in sub-Saharan African and Asia-Pacific nations. For example, 70% of Nigerians hold this view, as do 61% of Japanese adults. Views are also very positive in Israel, where 80% say the U.S. government respects its people's freedoms.

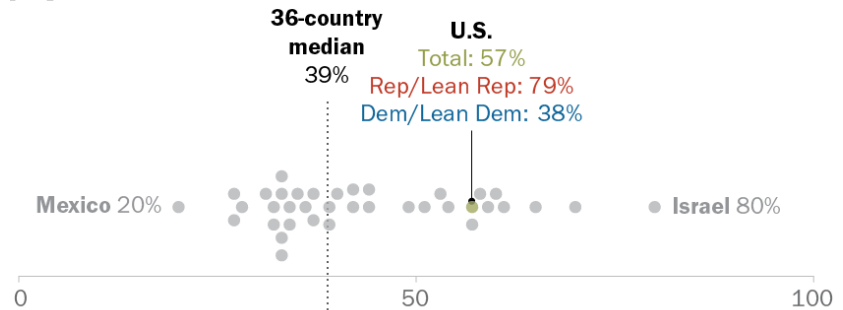
Fewer tend to express this opinion in Europe and Latin America. In Mexico, for example, 20% say the U.S. government respects its people's freedoms, while 77% say it does not. And in nearly all of the countries where we also asked this question in 2021, at the start of the Biden administration, the share saying the U.S. respects its people's freedoms has decreased by double digits.

A majority of Americans (57%) say the U.S. government respects its people's freedoms, a higher share than in most of the other 36 countries surveyed. Around eight-in-ten Republicans (79%) hold this view, compared with around four-in-ten Democrats (38%).

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European views of Trump and the U.S. are especially negative

Attitudes toward the United States and President Donald Trump are negative in regions across the globe. However, Europeans stand out for especially unfavorable views.

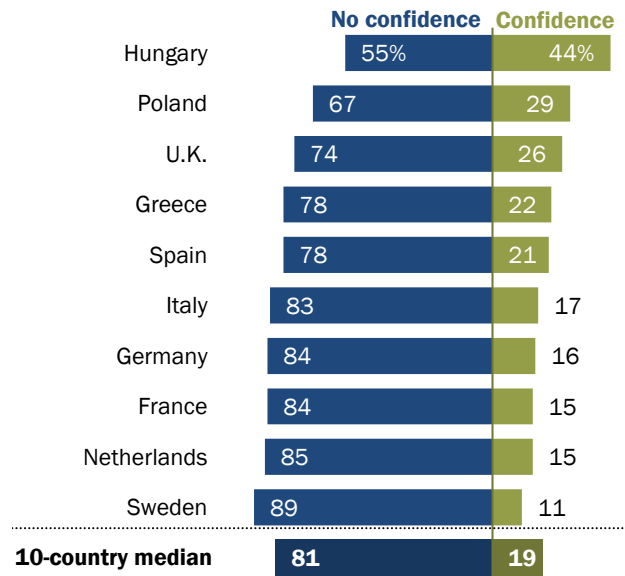
These findings come from a new Pew Research Center survey of 42,151 adults in 36 countries, conducted Feb. 8-May 13, 2026. They are [part of a larger report](#) focused on views of the U.S. and its president.

Few Europeans have confidence in Trump. Majorities in all 10 European nations polled say they lack confidence in him to do the right thing regarding world affairs – and in eight of these countries, roughly three-quarters of the public or more express this view.

Trump’s confidence ratings are down significantly in eight European nations since 2025, including drops of 15 percentage points in Greece and Italy.

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As in previous surveys, Trump is more popular among people with favorable views of right-wing populist parties.

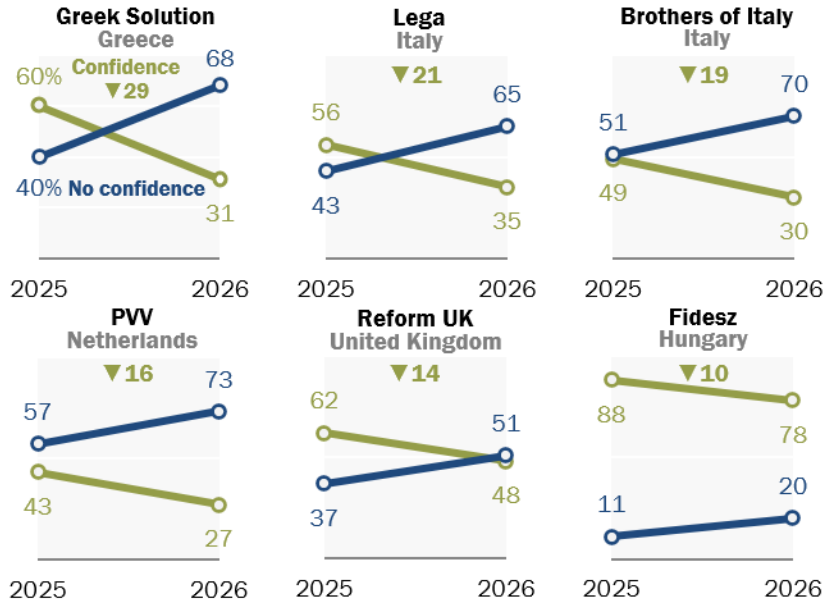
However, confidence in Trump is down significantly among right-wing populists in several nations.

For more on how we classify populist parties, refer to [Appendix B](#).

For example, 49% of Italians with a positive view of Brothers of Italy had confidence in Trump in 2025, compared with 30% this year.

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Most disapprove of how Trump is handling major issues, especially Greenland and tariffs. A median of 85% across the 10 nations disapprove of how he is dealing with these two issues. Trump receives poor reviews on other issues as well, including the conflict in Gaza, the Russia-Ukraine war and Iran.

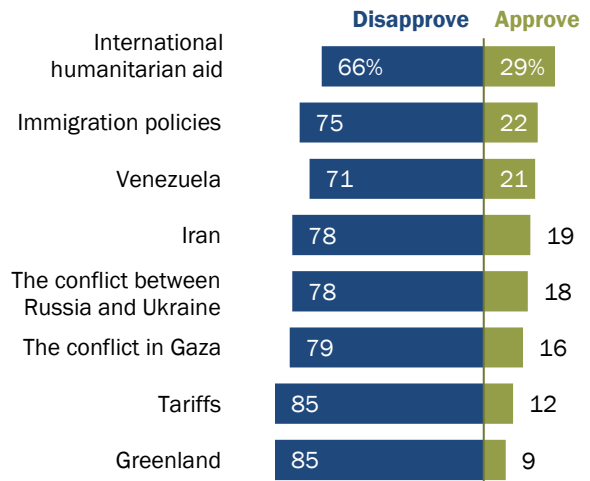
What is a median?

In this analysis, median scores are used to help readers see overall patterns in the data. The median percentage is the middle number in a list of all percentages sorted from highest to lowest.

Overall ratings for the U.S. have also declined over the past year in six of the 10 European nations we surveyed. Hungary is the only country where a majority of people (58%) now express a favorable opinion of the U.S. Swedes give the U.S. its lowest marks (19%).

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The U.S. is no longer seen as reliable in many European nations. Hungary and Poland are the only countries where a majority say the U.S. is a reliable partner – with Hungarians actually more likely to hold this view now than when we last asked in 2022, during the Biden administration. However, in eight other nations, the share who think the U.S. is reliable has fallen by anywhere from 28 to 52 percentage points.

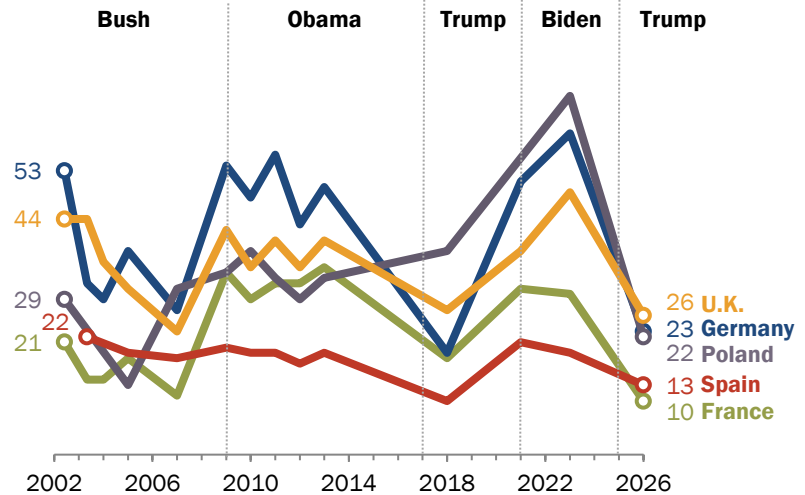
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Similarly, **Europeans have become less likely to think the U.S. considers other countries' interests** when making foreign policy. In nine nations, the share who say the U.S. considers the interests of countries like theirs has declined significantly since 2023.

In countries where we've asked this question many times over the years, attitudes resemble what we found in the early and mid-2000s, another period of trans-Atlantic tensions resulting from a war in the Middle East and other issues.

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In middle-income nations, most say the U.S. interferes in other countries' affairs

Majorities in 16 of 17 middle-income nations (as defined by [World Bank lending groups](#)) surveyed say the United States interferes in the affairs of other countries a great deal or a fair amount.

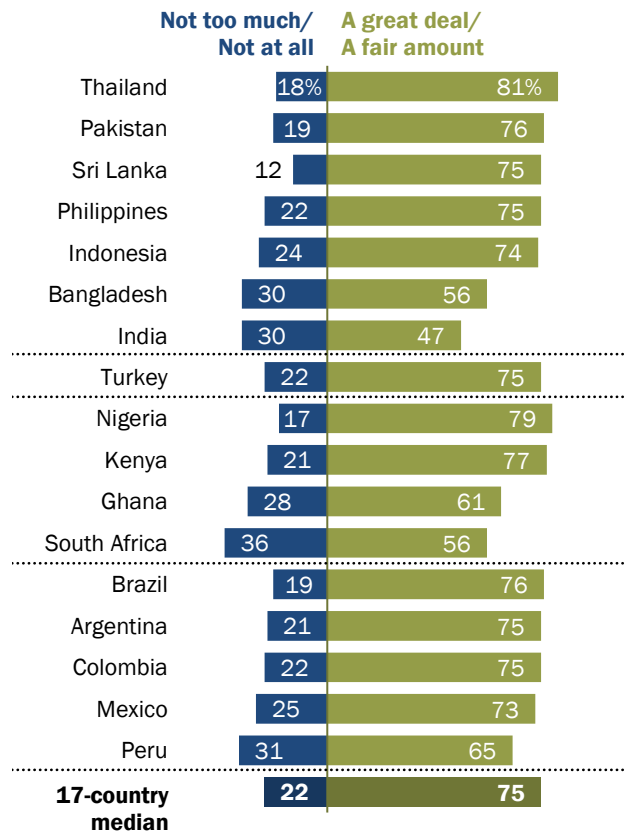
These findings come from a new Pew Research Center survey of 42,151 adults in 36 countries, conducted Feb. 8-May 13, 2026. They are [part of a larger report](#) focused on views of the U.S. and its president.

In 12 nations, roughly three-quarters of adults or more say the U.S. interferes in the affairs of other countries.

Thai adults are especially likely to say the U.S. interferes (81% hold this view). India is the only nation where this is a minority opinion. Still, Indians are more likely to say the U.S. interferes than to say it does not (47% vs. 30%; another 23% did not answer the question).

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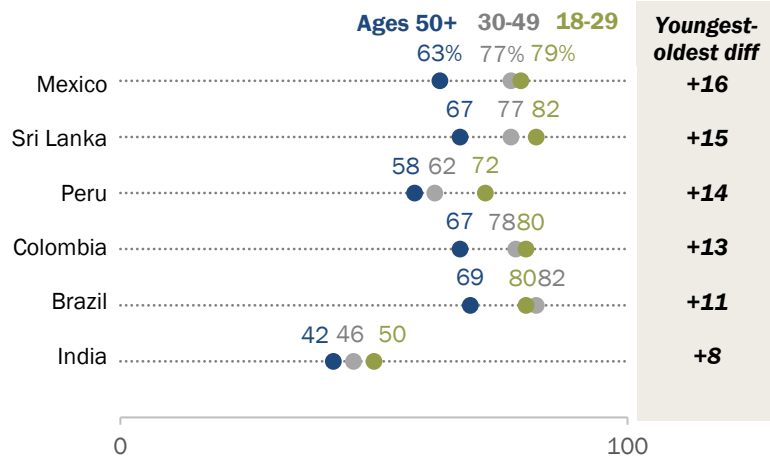
Views by age and gender

In several countries, including four of the five middle-income Latin American countries surveyed, younger adults (ages 18 to 34) are more likely than those ages 50 and older to say the U.S. interferes with other countries. For example, 79% of young people in Mexico say the U.S. interferes, compared with 63% of those ages 50 and older. (Older adults are also less likely to provide a response in many of these places.)

Men are more likely than women to say the U.S. interferes with other countries in 13 of these 17 middle-income countries. For example, 66% of men in Ghana say the U.S. interferes in the affairs of other countries, while 56% of women say the same. (Women are also less likely to provide a response in most of these places. In Ghana, women are twice as likely than men to not respond to the question.)

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How do Americans’ opinions compare?

A large majority of Americans (83%) also say the U.S. interferes in the affairs of other countries. Democrats and Democratic-leaning independents are more likely than Republicans and Republican leaners to hold this view, but majorities in both parties agree that the U.S. interferes at least a fair amount.

Of the four questions our survey asked about the United States’ role in the world (interference in countries’ affairs, contributions to global peace and stability, accounting for international interests and reliability as a partner) this is the only one on which majorities of partisans are aligned.

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Appendix B: Classifying European political parties

Classifying parties as populist

Although experts generally agree that populist political leaders or parties display high levels of anti-elitism, definitions of populism vary. We use three measures to classify parties as populist: anti-elite ratings from the [2024 Chapel Hill Expert Survey](#) (CHES), the [2023 Populism and Political Parties Expert Survey](#) (POPPA) and the [2023 PopuList](#). We define a party as populist when at least two of these three measures classify it as such.

CHES, which was conducted from October to December 2024, asked 609 political scientists specializing in political parties and European integration to evaluate the 2024 positions of 279 European political parties across all European Union member states, except for Luxembourg. The survey also gathered their views of parties in Iceland, Norway, Switzerland, Turkey and the United Kingdom. CHES results are regularly used by academics to classify parties with regard to their left-right ideological leanings, their key party platform positions and their degree of populism, among other things.

We measure anti-elitism using an average of two variables in the CHES data. First, we used “PEOPLE_VS_ELITE,” which asked the experts to measure the parties with regard to their position on direct versus representative democracy, where 0 means the parties support elected officeholders making the most important decisions and 10 means the parties support “the people,” not politicians, making the most important decisions. Second, we used “ANTI-ELITE_SALIENCE,” which is a measure of the salience of anti-establishment and anti-elite rhetoric for that particular party, with 0 meaning the rhetoric is not at all salient and 10 meaning it is extremely salient. The average of these two measures is shown in the table below as “anti-elitism.” We define parties that score 7.0 or more as populist.

POPPA, which was fielded between January and May 2023, asked 324 experts to measure positions and attitudes of 312 political parties on key characteristics related to populism and political representation in 31 European countries. We used “POPULISM_MEAN,” which is an average of five indicators:

- “MANICHEAN,” which is a measure of the extent to which parties see politics as a moral struggle between good and bad, with 0 meaning not at all Manichean and 10 meaning very Manichean
- “INDIVISIBLE,” which is a measure of the extent to which some parties consider the ordinary people to be indivisible, with 0 meaning not at all indivisible and 10 meaning very indivisible

- “GENERALWILL,” which is a measure of the extent to which some parties consider the ordinary people’s interest to be singular, with 0 meaning not at all singular and 10 meaning very singular
- “PEOPLECENTRISM,” which is a measure of the extent to which some parties believe that sovereignty should lie exclusively with the ordinary people, not the elites, with 0 meaning not at all people-centered and 10 meaning very people-centered
- “ANTIELITISM,” which is a measure of the extent to which some parties are characterized by their attitudes toward the establishment and elites, with 0 meaning not at all anti-elitist and 10 meaning very anti-elitist

We define parties that score 7.0 or more on the “POPULISM_MEAN” measure as populist.

The PopuList is a project to classify European political parties as populist, far right or far left. The project specifically looks at parties that have won at least one seat or 2% of a national parliamentary election since 1989. In an iterative process, comparative and country experts collaborate to classify parties based on their core ideological attributes. This appendix uses The PopuList 3.0.

Classifying parties as left, right or center

We can further classify traditional and populist parties into three groups: left, right and center. When classifying parties based on ideology, we relied on the variable “LRGEN” in the CHES dataset. CHES asked experts to rate the positions of each party in terms of its overall ideological stance, with 0 meaning extreme left, 5 meaning center and 10 meaning extreme right. We define left parties as those that score below 4.5 and right parties as those that score above 5.5. Parties in the center have ratings between 4.5 and 5.5.

The POPPA dataset also measures party ideology with the variable “LROVERALL.” POPPA asked experts to rate each party’s overall ideology on a scale ranging from 0, meaning left, to 10, meaning right. We considered left parties as those that score below 4.5 and right parties as those that score above 5.5. Parties in the center have ratings between 4.5 and 5.5. We used POPPA to confirm CHES’s ratings, with 100% agreement on the parties we classify as populist based on the methodology explained above.

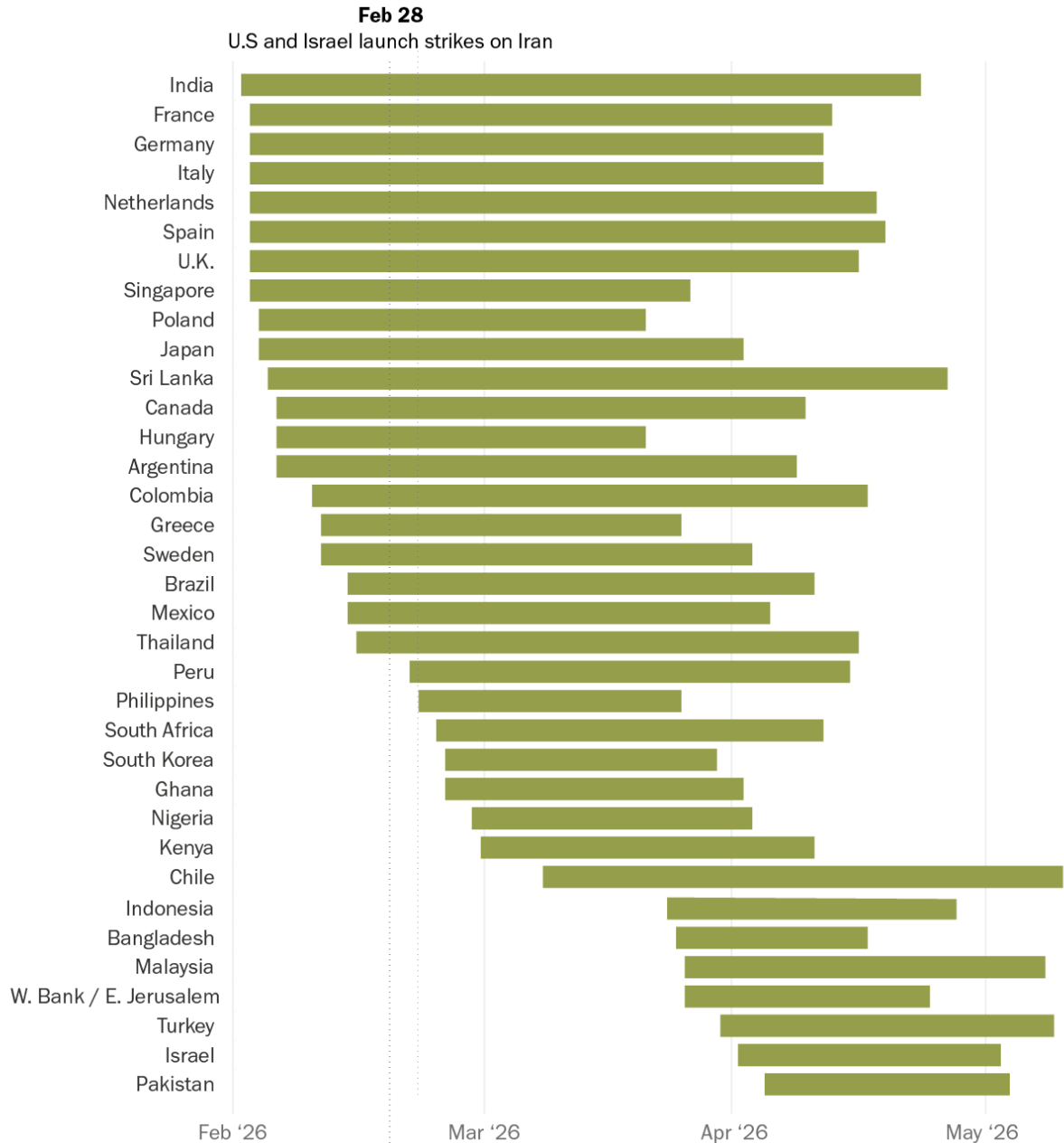

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Methodology

About Pew Research Center's Spring 2026 Global Attitudes Survey

Results for the survey are based on a mix of telephone, face-to-face and online interviews conducted under the direction of Gallup, Langer Research Associates and Social Research Centre. The results are based on national samples, unless otherwise noted. Read more about our [international survey methodology and country-specific sample designs](#).

Some, but not all, of our international analyses and reports use demographic variables or categorizations based on external data. We explain these more below:

Ideology

We analyze respondents' attitudes based on where they place themselves on an ideological scale. We asked about political ideology using several slightly different scales and categorized people as being on the ideological left, center or right.

- In most countries, we asked people to place themselves on a scale ranging from “Extreme left” to “Extreme right.” The question was asked this way in Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Mexico, the Netherlands, Nigeria, Peru, the Philippines, Poland, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Turkey and the U.K.
- In Japan, Singapore, South Korea and Thailand ideology was measured on a scale from “Extremely progressive” to “Extremely conservative.”
- In the U.S., ideology is defined as conservative (right), moderate (center) and liberal (left).
- Ideology was not asked about in Ghana, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia, Pakistan, Sri Lanka or the West Bank and East Jerusalem.

Religious identification

In each country surveyed, people were asked about their current religious identification. We then analyzed religious groups with sample sizes large enough to be reliable. Respondents of other religious backgrounds are still included in the national totals, even if we were not able to analyze their religious group separately.

High- and middle-income countries

Countries are classified as either high- or middle-income based on [categories from the World Bank](#) that rely on per capita gross national income. This is a classification we have used in other

Pew Research Center analyses, including when looking at [global views of China](#), [satisfaction with democracy](#), [globalization](#) and [national identity](#).

The American Trends Panel survey methodology

Overview

Data in this report comes from Wave 190 of the American Trends Panel (ATP), Pew Research Center’s nationally representative panel of randomly selected U.S. adults. The survey was conducted from March 23 to March 29, 2026. A total of 3,507 panelists responded out of 4,046 who were sampled, for a survey-level response rate of 87%.

The cumulative response rate accounting for nonresponse to the recruitment surveys and attrition is 3%. The break-off rate among panelists who logged on to the survey and completed at least one item is 1%. The margin of sampling error for the full sample of 3,507 respondents is plus or minus 1.9 percentage points.

The survey includes an [oversample](#) of Muslim, Jewish and non-Hispanic Asian adults in order to provide more precise estimates of the opinions and experiences of these smaller demographic subgroups. These oversampled groups are weighted back to reflect their correct proportions in the population.

SSRS conducted the survey for Pew Research Center via online (n=3,377) and live telephone (n=130) interviewing. Interviews were conducted in both English and Spanish.

Panel recruitment

Since 2018, the ATP has used address-based sampling (ABS) for recruitment. A study cover letter and a pre-incentive are mailed to a stratified, random sample of households selected from the U.S. Postal Service’s Computerized Delivery Sequence File. This Postal Service file has been estimated to cover 90% to 98% of the population.¹ Within each sampled household, the adult with the next birthday is selected to participate. Other details of the ABS recruitment protocol have changed over time but are available upon request.² Prior to 2018, the ATP was recruited using landline and cellphone random-digit-dial surveys administered in English and Spanish.

A national sample of U.S. adults has been recruited to the ATP approximately once per year since 2014. In some years, the recruitment has included additional efforts (known as an “oversample”) to improve the accuracy of data for underrepresented groups. For example, Hispanic adults, Black adults and Asian adults were oversampled in 2019, 2022 and 2023, respectively.

Sample design

The overall target population for this survey was noninstitutionalized persons ages 18 and older living in the United States. It featured a stratified random sample from the ATP in which Muslim, Jewish, and non-Hispanic Asian adults were selected with certainty. The remaining panelists were sampled at rates designed to ensure that the share of respondents in each stratum is proportional to its share of the U.S. adult population to the greatest extent possible. Respondent weights are adjusted to account for differential probabilities of selection as described in the Weighting section below.

Questionnaire development and testing

The questionnaire was developed by Pew Research Center in consultation with SSRS. The web program used for online respondents was rigorously tested on both PC and mobile devices by the SSRS project team and Pew Research Center researchers. The SSRS project team also populated test data that was analyzed in SPSS to ensure the logic and randomizations were working as intended before launching the survey.

Incentives

All respondents were offered a post-paid incentive for their participation. Respondents could choose to receive the post-paid incentive in the form of a check or gift code to Amazon.com, Target.com or Walmart.com. Incentive amounts ranged from \$5 to \$20 depending on whether the respondent belongs to a part of the population that is harder or easier to reach. Differential

incentive amounts were designed to increase panel survey participation among groups that traditionally have low survey response propensities.

Data collection protocol

The data collection field period for this survey was March 23 to March 29, 2026. Surveys were conducted via self-administered web survey or by live telephone interviewing.

For panelists who take surveys online:³ Postcard notifications were mailed to a subset on March 23.⁴ Survey invitations were sent out in two separate launches: soft launch and full launch. Sixty panelists were included in the soft launch, which began with an initial invitation sent on March 23. All remaining English- and Spanish-speaking sampled online panelists were included in the full launch and were sent an invitation on March 24.

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Panelists participating online were sent an email invitation and up to two email reminders if they did not respond to the survey. ATP panelists who consented to SMS messages were sent an SMS invitation with a link to the survey and up to two SMS reminders.

For panelists who take surveys over the phone with a live interviewer: Prenotification postcards were mailed on March 20. Soft launch took place on March 23 and involved dialing until a total of three interviews had been completed. All remaining English- and Spanish-speaking sampled phone panelists' numbers were dialed throughout the remaining field period. Panelists who take surveys via phone can receive up to six calls from trained SSRS interviewers.

Data quality checks

To ensure high-quality data, Center researchers performed data quality checks to identify any respondents showing patterns of satisficing. This includes checking for whether respondents left questions blank at very high rates or always selected the first or last answer presented. As a result

of this checking, five ATP respondents were removed from the survey dataset prior to weighting and analysis.

Weighting

The ATP data is weighted in a process that accounts for multiple stages of sampling and nonresponse that occur at different points in the panel survey process. First, each panelist begins with a base weight that reflects their probability of recruitment into the panel. These weights are then calibrated to align with the population benchmarks in the accompanying table to correct for nonresponse to recruitment surveys and panel attrition. If only a subsample of panelists was invited to participate in the wave, this weight is adjusted to account for any differential probabilities of selection.

Among the panelists who completed the survey, this weight is then calibrated again to align with the population benchmarks identified in the accompanying table and trimmed at the 1st and 99th percentiles to reduce the loss in precision stemming from variance in the weights.

Sampling errors and tests of statistical significance take into account the effect of weighting.

The following table shows the unweighted sample sizes and the error attributable to sampling that would be expected at the 95% level of confidence for different groups in the survey.

- Combined totals are based on unrounded topline figures. Prior to 2024, combined totals were based on rounded topline figures, so they may differ from previous years.
- We have changed our survey mode in several countries at certain points. For some mode shifts, we may provide trends from another mode for comparison in separate topline tables. The extent of the mode differences varies across questions; while there are negligible differences on some questions, others have more pronounced differences. Caution should be taken when comparing across modes. Some of these changes include:
 - Surveys in the U.S. and Australia, which are now conducted primarily online, rather than by telephone.
 - Since 2024, surveys in Hungary and Poland have been conducted by telephone; all prior surveys in Hungary and Poland were conducted face-to-face.
 - Since 2020, the Italy survey has been conducted by telephone; surveys were conducted face-to-face in 2002 and 2007-2019.
 - Since 2021, the Greece survey has been conducted by telephone; all prior surveys in Greece were conducted face-to-face.
- We conducted both telephone and face-to-face surveys in Hungary and Poland in 2024. Data in our 2024 reports was from the face-to-face survey. Starting in 2025, the 2024 trends reference data from the telephone survey, where available, and may differ from earlier reports.
- Some data from India in 2023 is not directly comparable to the current survey due to large differences in item nonresponse (such as when respondents say they don’t know the answer to a question). The data is included in a separate table for reference, where relevant.

- Some data from Bangladesh and Thailand in 2014 is not directly comparable to the current survey due to large differences in item nonresponse. The data is included in a separate table to reference, where relevant.
- For some countries, trends for certain years are omitted due to differences in sample design or population coverage. Omitted trends often reflect less representative samples than more recent surveys in the same countries.
- Not all questions included in the Spring 2026 Global Attitudes Survey are presented in this topline. Omitted questions have either been previously released or will be released in future reports.
