Note	Due to a translation error identified after publication, the question (Q34/Q36a) on the Mexico survey asked about the importance of being "Catholic" rather than being "Christian." Care should be taken when directly comparing Mexico to other countries on this question. We also edited tables listing the religion asked about in each country to reflect this change.
