ABOUT THIS SURVEY

Results for the six-nation survey are based on telephone interviews conducted under the direction of Princeton Survey Research Associates among a nationwide, representative sample of adults, 18 years of age and older, in France, Germany, Britain and the U.S. In Russia, telephone interviews were conducted with adults in 10 cities: Moscow, St. Petersburg, Voronezh, Ekaterinburg, Kazan, Krasnodar, Nizhnii Novgorod, Novosibirsk, Samara and Khabarovsk. In Turkey face-to-face interviews were conducted with a nationwide, representative sample of adults 18 years of age and older. The fieldwork was conducted by IFOP in France, Emnid in Germany, NOP in Britain, Romir in Russia, TNS PIAR in Turkey, and Princeton Data Source in the U.S. For results based on the total sample in each of the six countries, one can say with 95% confidence that the error attributable to sampling and other random effects is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

In addition to sampling error, one should bear in mind that question wording and practical difficulties in conducting surveys can introduce error bias into the findings of opinion polls.
